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WHAT IS NEWFORCE?

We are a program of Generation West Virginia dedicated to training and readying West Virginians to join the tech industry.

- Six-month program: Our immersive, full-time software development training comes with real-time support and instruction.
- Tuition free: We train West Virginians, free of charge.
- Need-based living stipend: We don't want anyone to have to choose between attending NewForce and making ends meet, so we have a needs-based living stipend of \$11/hour [read more about this in our FAQ].
- Fully remote: Applications to NewForce are open to anyone living in West Virginia.
- Job-ready: 86% of our grads go on to work in software development within six months of graduation.

WHAT'S THE CATCH?

Think this sounds too good to be true? Don't worry, we've heard it before. As a program of Generation West Virginia, it's part of our mission to help West Virginians grow and thrive right here at home. We do this by admitting West Virginians of every background, training them to code, and helping them find careers in tech that will allow them to build the lives they want in the Mountain State.

ARE YOU CURIOUS ABOUT A CAREER IN SOFTWARE DEVELOPMENT?

You've come to the right place. This is an exciting industry, and we want to help make you a part of it.

While there are many benefits to a career in tech, here are our top five:

- 1. You'll never be bored. The tech industry is constantly changing, which means you'll always be learning new things.
- 2. High pay, high potential. Most of our graduates' starting salaries range from \$45k to \$55k, with alumni making up to \$120k within a few years of graduating the program.
- 3. Work remotely. Find a job you love without leaving the state!
- 4. Future-proof your skillset. Demand for software developers is projected to grow by 22% between 2020 and 2030.
- 5. Solve real-world problems. Coding is an incredible tool that can be applied to pretty much any real-world issue you can think of.

What makes a good software developer?

Curiosity. Above all, software developers are professional learners.
 Coding languages are always changing, so we're always updating our skills.

- Problem-solving skills. If you like tinkering, mapping out a process and working towards solutions, you'll probably like this job.
- Collaboration. We almost always work on teams. You'll be a good developer if you're great at communicating with people and asking questions.

TRY CODING

HERE'S AN EXAMPLE OF A DAY IN THE LIFE OF A SOFTWARE DEVELOPER

As a junior software developer, you'll spend most of your day writing code. You'll probably be adding functionality to a large app rather than building something from scratch, which means you'll be working with a team to get the job done.

9am - Clock into your home office and hop on a "daily stand-up" video call with the rest of your development team. In this meeting, you'll discuss your plans for the day and talk through any challenges you're facing. Someone on your team is stuck on a section of code that you worked on yesterday, so you offer to get on a separate call to help.

10am to Noon - Coding time! Your assigned tasks can vary a lot from one day to the next (and from one workplace to the next). Let's imagine, for the sake of example, that you're working for a food blogging platform. Your job today is to build a "save" button so that users can save recipes to their own personal recipe box. First, you work on a design according to your company's design guide. Then it's time to work on making the button do what it's supposed to do.

Lunch - You take a break for lunch. You've been problem-solving all morning and you deserve it!

1pm - A bug appears! Try as you might, you just can't get the save button to work. You google the problem for a while, and then you decide to ask a more senior developer on your team. That's ok! Junior developers are encouraged to ask for help-- it's how you learn.

2pm - Help call with your senior developer. She clears it up and shows you a new coding trick you've never seen before. Voila! The button works!

3pm - You submit your code for review. You're pretty sure it works, but a few other people on your team will need to test it before a real user ever sees it.

4pm - You start writing documentation for your new save button so that other developers on your team can modify your code if they need to.

5pm - The day is done! Woohoo!





WHAT DOES NEWFORCE COVER?

NewForce students graduate as junior full-stack software developers, which means they learn a combination of front-end and back-end technologies.

Our tech stack includes:

- HTML and CSS
- React.js
- C#/.NET
- SQL Server

Our students graduate with an impressive portfolio of their own work. You aren't just learning to code during NewForce - you're actually building apps you can show off to your future employer.

What are a few examples of apps built by past NewForce students during class?

- An app that helps you pick horror movies based on your preferences.
- An app that help schedule and manage lawn care teams.
- An app that helps you make the perfect cocktail based on ingredients you already have.
- An app that helps you keep track of movies you want to watch and rate movies you've already seen.

IS NEWFORCE THE PATH FOR YOU?

When you think of software developers, you might think of guys in hoodies banging away on their keyboards in their parent's basement, hacking into the Pentagon or building the next Facebook. While we all wish we could build the next Facebook, the reality is that software developers are pretty normal. We go to work, solve problems with our team, and then we go home to our families, hobbies and pets... just like you!

NewForce is full-time and virtual. Over the course of the six-month program, students are in a virtual classroom over Zoom with their cohort every weekday from 9am-4pm.




Zoom Classrooms

You'll also become a member of a growing network of NewForce grads: we have 75+ graduates working in the tech industry, with more each year. CAREER PREP AND PLACEMENT.

We're training you, but we're also helping you find your first job. We work extensively with local and national employers to find open entry-level positions that meet your skillset and unique experiences.

We also help you by:

- · Helping you build a tailored resume and cover letter
- Getting you a professional headshot
- Working with you on interview prep and telling your story
- Coaching you through the job search process
- Connecting you directly to employers through classroom visits, Demo Day, and postgraduation support

<u>I don't have a background in technology or software development, will I still be appealing to hiring teams?</u>

Yes! While you may be on a completely new path with your career in tech, many of our grads use their past experience in other industries, combine it with their new skills, and find a position or employer who aligns perfectly.

For example, we've helped a former banker become a software developer for a Financial Tech company, a graphic designer become a website designer, and a veteran go to work for a contracting agency that builds software for the federal government. In the tech industry, your past career makes you unique and valuable to employers who are looking for someone just like you.

NEWFORCE FAQ

We've gathered a list of our most frequently asked questions. Don't see yours on the list? Reach out to us at info@generationwv.org.

- What if I work full-time? NewForce is a full-time program. We expect you to treat it like a job and be in class from 9am to 4pm, Monday through Friday. You may qualify for our need-based living stipend of \$11/hour to support your training.
- What! A living stipend? That's right! See the next page for details.
- What are my chances of getting a job after NewForce? We can't guarantee job placement, but we'll do everything we can to help you and we expect you to put in the work after graduation of applying and interviewing widely. 86% of our grads have found work in tech within six months of graduation.
- What if I've never coded before? That's fine! You don't need any prior experience to come through NewForce. That said, if you want to get your feet wet before you commit, check out our Try Coding course and see if you like it.
- Generation West Virginia is an organization for young people. Am I too old to apply? Nope! We know that an economy that works for young folks is an economy that works for everyone. There's no upper age limit to apply to NewForce. (That said, you do need to be 18 or older, please.)
- Do you take everyone who applies? No, we only take 18 to 20 students per cohort.
- What can I expect from the admissions process? You'll fill out a written
 questionnaire with demographic information and short answer questions about
 yourself. Try to give us as much detail as possible in your application! From there,
 we choose around 40 people to interview. If we think you're a good fit, we'll ask
 you back for a second interview with our instructors.
- What are you looking for in applicants? We're looking for people who are self-motivated, great teammates, and love to learn. We designate half the seats in our class for underrepresented groups in tech, including veterans, people of color, women, LGBTQ+ folks, and people living below the poverty line. No matter your background, we encourage you to apply!
- I don't have a great laptop, can I still apply? Yes. We can provide loaner laptops to be used during NewForce.
- I don't have great wifi, can I still apply? Yes! we can help you find a workspace nearby with a stronger connection.
- <u>I'm not ready yet, will you have another cohort?</u> Yes! We run a cohort approximately every seven months (six months for each cohort with a month break in between). We're not going anywhere. If you're not ready yet, we'll see you next time!

LIVING STIPENDS

We want NewForce to work for everyone, which is why we're 100% tuition-free for everyone. But we've gotten lots of feedback from people who want to enroll and can't afford to quit their job to attend a full-time program. That's why we're introducing need-based living stipends. Qualified students will be paid \$11/hour for 35 hours a week for the 6 months of the program.

How do I find out if I qualify?

Because our living stipends are funded through a grant from the Department of Labor, we have to meet their specific qualifications. Here are some of the ways to qualify:

- You were recently laid off or terminated from a job
- You're employed part-time
- You're employed full-time but make less than \$45,000
- You're entering the workforce for the first time (including if you've been out of work for a long time or were formerly incarcerated)

We'll help you determine if you qualify on a case-by-case basis during your interview.
